It is with great pleasure that I announce the promotion of Manuel Orosa to Chief of Police effective December 19, 2011.

Manuel Orosa is a 31-year veteran of the Miami Police Department. During his career, he has held command positions in all divisions within the Miami Police Department. He commanded three different NET areas (Coral Way, Flagami, and Allapattah); Central Patrol District; and Internal Affairs. As commander of Criminal Investigations Section, he played a significant role in major cases including, police shootings, serial rapist, serial robberies and in the successful resolution of the murder of a police officer. He has coordinated the department's involvement in the highly-viewed television series, *The First 48*, which highlights Miami homicide detectives. He also played a role in major events such as the Free Trade Areas of the Americas Conference, the Hemisphere Police Chief's Conference, and all major hurricanes that threatened the city since 2005.

Manuel Manuel earned an Associate's Degree in Liberal Arts from Miami-Dade Community College. He is a graduate of the University of Louisville's Southern Police Institute, the Senior Management Institute for Police (SIMP), Police Executive Research Forum's Executive Strategies Management-Boston University/Harvard University's John F.
